Beaupré School, a two-room brick schoolhouse built in 1921 beside the historic Lac Ste. Anne Trail, became a museum in 2007. The re-purposed classrooms now bring local history to life. One classroom is still a schoolroom; other themes include a typical country home, Main Street, community and farm life. Changing exhibits tell the story of everyday life in this part of north-central Alberta.



The museum's Archives collection has school registers from many one-room schools dating back to 1909. Peruse books in our reading room from the early 1900s on.



- A representation of the original fort built and occupied by the North West Mounted Police from 1875 to 1885.
- A village of original pioneer buildings from the settlement era.
- A Warden's Residence (1937) with photos and stories from the Provincial Gaol (jail) that was located in Fort Saskatchewan from 1914 to 1988.
